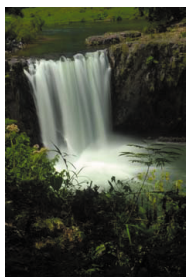


Why Raft With Rio Aventura Y Diversion?

Reservations and Payments

A \$500 per person deposit is required to secure your reservation. Final payment is due 60 days prior to departure. To secure a reservation on a trip departing within 60 days, full payment is required at the time of your reservation. Last minute bookings are subject to availability and may incur late fees and /or higher airfare costs.

Cancellations and Refunds

If you cancel your trip, you must notify us in writing or by fax. There is a non-refundable fee of \$50 per person for each tour canceled. A significant part of our expenses are committed long before departure. For all cancellations we will refund you the cost of your trip less the following charges per person:

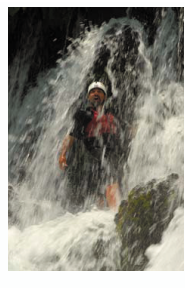

Our focus is whitewater, but we will do so much more, explore exotic jungles, meander through deep canyons dotted with ruins and pyramids of ancient Mesoamerican civilizations, explore the magical waterfalls of El Encanto, relax in the natural riverside hot springs of Rio Antiqua. Feast on delicious fruits, fresh fish, and exquisite Mexican Cuisine. Climb some of the largest pyramids in the world at the spectacular complex of Teotihuacan. Experience the vibrant nightlife and large city delights of Mexico City and Xalapa. Enjoy the time set aside for bargain hunting arts and crafts, local jewelry and antiques. Join us for eight full days of culture and natural enrichment.



Tour and River Difficulty



Perhaps the biggest misconception about river trips and adventure travel is that you need to be in excellent shape. The rivers included in most trips peak at class III+ rapids, however optional class IV/V is available. Our guests range

from eight year olds to 80 year olds. We offer these trips with full confidence supported by state of the art river and safety equipment. Our experienced guides take pride in exercising good judgement to assure that your river experience is safe, fun and unforgettable.

Itinerary

Day 1 (Sat) Afternoon arrival in Mexico City. Welcoming dinner. Fiesta with Mariachi bands at famous Garibaldi plaza, discover spot of Mexico's most famous singers and musicians. Located in the heart of the largest city in the world. Here we stay the night in a hotel.



Day 2 (Sun) Travel towards Tlapacoyan, Veracruz. On the way, tour the archeological complex of Cacaxtla. Built by the Cacaxtlan-Xicalancas, descendants of the Olmec Culture. Interpret the longest mural ever discovered dating back to Mesoamerica. Enjoy a local meal before continuing through the state of Tlaxcala, Puebla and Veracruz. We arrive in the evening in the picturesque town of Tlapacoyan, where we spend the next three nights.

Day 3 (Mon) Raft/Kayak the Rio Filos (class III), flowing through the Filo-Bobos ecological reserve. This all day river trip includes exploration of two different recently discovered archeological sites: Coajilote and Vega de La Peña. Built by the Totonac Civilization along the right bank of the river. Several hundred foot waterfalls cascade from the left canyon wall. Hike in this lush subtropical rainforest to see pyramids, ball courts, palaces and mythological stone carvings.

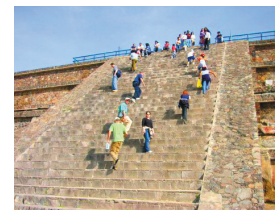


Day 4 (Tue) Rio Bobos (class III). Another full day awaits you. First explore a tributary stream lined with magnificent waterfalls. A short hike brings us to breathtaking Cascada Tomata. Afterwards we'll paddle through a narrow, majestic canyon to climb, swim and explore the fabulous natural grotto and the seventy foot waterfall, El Encanto, a truly natural temple. After lunch,

we run the Bobos for an exiting afternoon of whitewater. Special dinner at the local guide house, accompanied by Marimba fiesta.

Day 5 (Wed) We travel in the morning to Xalapa, capital of Veracruz. Here we'll paddle the Rio Antigua (class III/IV), depending on flows and group dynamics we may elect to run the Pescados or the Antigua section of this river. Either way, finish the afternoon at the riverside hot spring resort of Carrizal. Relax in the perfect 90-degree water, famous for its therapeutic attributes. We spend the next two nights in the same hotel in Xalapa.

Day 6 (Thu) The Rio Actopan (class III/IV) has a spectacular put-in. This is a very unique river. This Jewel gets almost all its flow from a pristine mega spring gushing out of the fern lined canyon wall. This water originates on the 18,000-foot peaks of the Sierra Madre range that includes nearby



Pico de Orizaba, the tallest mountain in Mexico. The headwaters are continuous, and after the first couple of rapids, the difficulty eases to class II/III for a memorable and enjoyable river finale. Evening in Xalapa, visit the local Salsa club.

Day 7 (Fri) Morning travel to Teotihuacan. After a delicious lunch, tour this remarkable ancient city. Climb the huge pyramids of the Sun and Moon. Walk through the temple of Quetzalcoatl. Hide in mysterious meeting chambers. Marvel at the mere size of this Mesoamerican metropolis. Depending on time of the year, traffic and local festivities we may elect to visit the little known site of Cantona, a magnificent ancient city that leaves a long lasting impression on any one that visits. Travel to the heart of Mexico City. Tour the Downtown Square of El Zocalo and enjoy our farewell dinner party. Hotel stay.

Day 8 (Sat) Departure day. Depending on flight itinerary, time for additional touring. Departure from Mexico City Airport.

Total Cost: \$1395.00

Includes: equipment, lodging, tours, meals and transportation to and from the airport in Mexico City. Departure dates usually run from October through April. Additional itineraries are available in the Chiapas region and on the Rio Santa Maria.
